They are just waiting on the finalizing of the BSI Tournament Schedule in order that they can schedule our own Club Tournaments & Fun Days and also determine start days for our Leagues & Ladders, this should be available by the first week of April.



Davie and I met with Westshore earlier this month for our contract renewal, related membership fees and some language reversals that were introduced because of Covid, there will be another email coming out shortly with the breakdown of this year's fees.



Since we will be hosting the Lawn Bowling for the BC55+ Games in the third week of September we were also able to get a one-week extension on our season with Clubhouse access until October 9th, this will help accommodate our Bowl for the Cure fund raiser on October 2nd & 3rd.

This year for the Canadian Government's "New Horizon Grant for Seniors" we applied for monies to replace all the rotted out plinths and backboards on the greens and we are pleased to report that we have been approved for the full amount of \$25,000 this is for materials only and Westshore personnel will supply the required labour, so during the season you will be seeing temporary closure of one green at a time while they work their way through the project with minimal disruption.
