GENERAL WOMEN'S RULES GOVERNING CLOSED AND OPEN TOURNAMENTS

All Inter club Closed and Open Tournaments are controlled or organized by BSI Women's Games Chairs are subject to Crystal Mark 4 Laws of the Sport.

The Women's Games Book contains the current local and pertinent information governing all women's competitions and tournaments under the jurisdiction of BSI.

Changes to the Women's Games book are to be made at a meeting held at the end of the bowling season, which all Women members may attend. The voting delegates will be one from each club, i.e. club's women's games chair or her designated representative.

Two weeks notice shall be given to each club with issues brought forth during the season for discussion by each club before the update meeting is held.

The following points should be noted:

- 1. **SECTION A** -refers to rules, which generally apply to all events
- 2. **SECTION B** -lists the Closed Competitions offered by BSI noting specific rules which govern each event
- 3. **SECTION C**-lists the Open Tournaments offered by BSI noting the specific rules that govern each event
- 4. That the BSI Women's Games Chair will chair TWO meetings with ALL Club Women's Games Chairs in attendance.

SECTION A

GENERAL RULES FOR ALL EVENTS

A1 -ALL CLOSED AND OPEN TOURNAMENTS controlled and organized by BSI are subject to Crystal Mark 4 Laws of the Sport

A2 -JURISDICTION OVER GREENS

BSI has no jurisdiction over any of the greens.

A3 -DATES OF PLAY

Setting dates of play is the responsibility of BSI Women's and Men's Games Committees. Dates of play are currently scheduled yearly at a combined meeting of Women's and Men's Games Committees.

A4 -FORMATION OF TEAMS AND LIMITATIONS

BSI Women can bowl in Closed Tournaments during the year as long as they all belong to the same club.

Closed tournaments are Anne Webster Triples, Margaret Smith Daffodil Pairs.

In the event of an odd number of entries at a tournament registration deadline that tournament managers have the discretion, as a last resort, to make up an open team to be included in the draw. Last entry to be dropped if uneven and Host club can't get a team.

A5 -ELIGIBLITY OF GUESTS

It is the responsibility of each club to decide whether a short-term guest member who does Pay club dues is eligible to play in BSI events other than the Open Tournaments.

A6 -DRESS CODE

- 1. BSI Women's Games Chairs will enforce a dress code.
- 2. Shorts, Skirts, Skorts no shorter than 4 inches above the knee.
- 3. Shirts must have modest necklines and they can be with or without sleeves but must not have spaghetti straps.
- 4. No Blue Jeans
- 5. Teams must be in the same colour but not red.
- 6. Any issue with the dress code is to be dealt with by the tournament director from the hosting club who will speak to the person(s) involved.
- 7. Footwear must adhere to the Crystal Mark 4 Laws of the Sport
- 8. Rain Gear may be any colour(s).
- 9. Markers must be dressed all in White or Cream.

A7 - ENTRY FEE

Fees will be \$20.00 per person per event.

From the \$20.00 entry fee, the host club will use part of this fee to pay Green Fees, Umpires \$30.00/session, Fees to Women's Games (Suspended until 2027 Oct 2021 Mtg.), the rest will be used for distribution of Prizes. See attached forms at end of book.

A8 -PLACE OF PLAY

On green(s) of Host Club, and when necessary overflow goes to another green.

A9 -TRIAL ENDS

Trial ends will be reinstated before first game, at change of direction and change of green. Trial ends before the start of all other games would be at the discretion of the teams. Trial ends must be finished before start time of games.

Removed November meeting 2023. We will now play 16 ends, 1 point for first two ends.

A10 -PUNCTUALITY (LATE ARRIVAL)

When an entry is late for a BSI game, the following time schedule is used:

1 to 5 minutes -no penalty 6 to 10 minutes -1-point penalty

11 to 15 minutes -2-point penalty: 1 end counted as played 16 to 20 minutes -3-point penalty: 2 ends counted as played

After 20 minutes -game forfeited to opponents

The Games Committee may waive these penalties in the event of unforeseen circumstances.

A11 -BELL STARTS AND BELL FINISHES

This will vary now due to the fact that we have gone to 4 Bowl Pairs and all of the Tournaments are now 2 Games per day. Please refer to the Tournament Information for each Tournament at the rear of this Book.

A12 -SUBSTITUTIONS DURING TEAM PLAY

A substitute must not have already played in the event: must be approved by the Games Committee in charge of the event,
must be placed as instructed in Crystal Mark 4 Laws of the Sport.

A13 -FORFEITURE OF PLAYED GAMES

If an entry withdraws for any reason, all games played by the entry are forfeited.

A14 -POSTPONEMENT OF A GAME DUE TO INCLEMENT WEATHER

When a BSI game must be postponed due to inclement weather, the decision to postpone The game must be made at the host green by the Games Committee in charge of the event. The decision to postpone must NOT be made until at least 30 minutes after the time set for play to commence. If an entry scheduled to play in the game in question has not reported to the the green of play by the time the decision to postpone has been made, they forfeit the game to their opponents.

A15 -CANCELLATION OF AN EVENT

Women's BSI events can be cancelled only with the APPROVAL OF THE BSI WOMEN'S GAME'S COMMITTEE. E.G. LACK OF ENTRIES

A16 -OMISSION OF GAMES IN A ROUND ROBIN

All games of a Round Robin must be played if EITHER ENTRY is in contention.

If the playing of the LAST game in a Round Robin will not in any way affect the results of This competition, this game need not be played, provided both skips on each team (team play) Or both players in singles game agree.

The decision not to play the last game must be made before leaving the host green, and must be approved by the Games Committee in charge of the event.

A17 -VALUE OF PRIZES

In Pairs and Triples playing 2 days/ 2 games per day will pay Top 4, up to 6 Prizes dependant on entries. See Prize Allocation S/S.

A18 -PRESENTATION OF PRIZES

Whether trophies and plaques are presented to the winner, it is up to the host club to decide after trophies are engraved that they be kept at the club or allowed to go home with the winner.

However, all trophies and plaques are to remain on Vancouver Island.

A19 -ENGRAVING COSTS

Engraving costs of trophies and plaques shall come from accumulated tournament proceeds. Club Receipts to be given to BSI Game's Chair for reimbursement. This will happen at the October meeting.

A20 -REMAINING TOURNAMENT PROCEEDS

At the Women's Games Fall meeting, a decision will be made of what to do with any remaining Tournament proceeds.

A21 -BURNT ENDS

All Dead (Burnt) ends will be reset on the 2 Meter Center Mark

A22 -VERBAL ABUSE

Verbal abuse of an opponent or official will not be tolerated.

When profanity is used, the offending player will be subject to a fine of \$50 for the first offence, Continuing abuse will cause suspension of the player from further games during this Tournament.

It is the Responsibility of the Tournament Director to ensure that the fine is paid immediately. Fine must be paid before the start of the next round.

CRYSTAL MARK 4 LAWS OF THE SPORT WILL APPLY.

PAIRS / TRIPLES

METHOD OF PLAY

BSI WOMEN'S PAIRS TOURNAMENTS WILL GO BACK TO 4 BOWLS, (November 2023 meeting) BSI WOMEN'S PAIRS AND TRIPLES GAMES WILL HAVE A TIME LIMIT OF 2 1/2 HOURS. EXCEPTION BEING 2 BOWL 6 PACK.

IN ALL TOURNAMENTS EXCEPT FOR THE 2 BOWL 6 PACK TRIPLES CAP THE DIFFERENTIAL AT 15 POINTS.

ALL CLOSED TOURNAMENTS HAVE CHANGED THEIR FORMAT TO 2 GAMES PER DAY. THERE WILL BE NO SECTION PLAY.

ANNE WEBSTER: CLOSED -TRIPLES (LAKEHILL LBC)

N.B. The Anne Webster Triples requires a player on the team 2 years or less experience. (Mar 2024 Meeting)

Player 2 years or less will be made an open Position.

Player 2 years or less can play in any position in this tournament.

Prizes... Top 4, up to 6 dependant on entries, See Prize allocation S/S.

MARGARET SMITH DAFFODIL TROPHY: CLOSED -PAIRS (CENTRAL SAANICH)

Prizes...Top 4, up to 6 dependant of entries. See Prize allocation S/S.

BSI SINGLES: (APPLY TO JOAN PRICE QUADDIE SINGLES)

FORMAT OF PLAY:

- SINGLES will play to 15 Points with a time limit of 1 1/2 hours, or whichever comes first. (i.e. the winner will be the player to win 15 points)
- When the BELL is rung at 1 1/2 hours, finish the end you are playing
- If the score is TIED, then an extra end will be played to break the tie
- If the tie is 14-14 and a bowler wins more points in the tie breaking end, only the tied points will count
- A game win 3 Points, a game loss scores 0 Points
- Winners will be decided by total points after all games have been played
- Shots for divided by shots against will be used if points are the same

NOVICE WOMEN'S SINGLES TOURNAMENT

PLACE:

Venue will be played at the green of the BSI Chair Tournament changed to weekend play, Format based on number of entries.

START TIME: 9:00 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday.

There will be a maximum of 3 Games per day.

PLAYERS ELIGIBLE:

Members of affiliated Clubs who are new to the game of Bowls and who Joined their club after the completion of the Novice singles Competition the previous year, and who has won this year's Novice Singles Competition.

Club novice tournament winner to be sent and/or if no novice club playoff, the games chair will send novice player of choice.

Please note in 2023 any member who joins after Aug 31, will be a novice for the 2024 Season.

Each Championship is a competition between novice representatives of the 11 BSI District clubs. Clubs submit the name of one participant each. How representatives are chosen is up to the individual club.

The host club is encouraged to enter a second contestant if the draw numbers are uneven. Should the host club be unable to supply an extra novice, the other clubs would be invited to put names forward with the extra spot drawn from a hat by the host club's Tournament Director. The max numbers of entries will be 12.

MARKERS: EACH CLUB is expected to provide at least 2 Qualified Markers.

FORMAT: This will be a 2 day event. With a Max of 6 games played.

For tournaments with more than six entries, two pools will be formed.

Competitions of less than 7 entries will play one another in a round robin format, With the finisher awarded the trophy. The player with most points or, the case of a tie best aggregate score is declared Champion.

In the case of 8 entries the winners of each pool play a cross-over match against the second place winners. The winners of the cross-over play for the Championships, while the losers play for third and fourth.

Winners of pool play involving 10 - 12 entries play for the Championships while second place Pool finishers play for the third and fourth.

FEE: A \$20 entry fee will be paid by each participant. This fee will cover the Umpire's fee and prize money for the top three finishers.

The host club first collects 10% off the top of the entry fees. This money will go towards engraving the trophy.

The host club holds the trophy until the following year.

Conditions of Play:

Play to 15 points with a time limit of 1.75 hours, or whichever comes first (i.e. the winner will be the player to win 15 points)

When the bell is rung at 1.75 hours, finish the end you are playing.

If the score is tied 14-14 e.g., then an extra end will be played to break the tie.

The winner of the tie-breaker is awarded a max of 15 points.

A game won scores 3 tournament points, a game lost will score 0 points.

Winners will be decided by total tournament points after all games have been played.

Shots for divided by shots against will be used if tournament points are the same.

WINNER of Competition has name engraved on Novice Plaque plus a keepsake pin or medallion engraved with year won.

Each Participant will receive a Dogwood Pin until supplies run out. March 2022 meeting.

METHOD OF PLAY: Round Robin is played. Each Game use 2 Bowls – 6 Ends.

Maximum Entry 14 teams

2 Spaces allotted for Cowichan Teams.

One Space allotted for previous year Winner.

11 spaces remaining will be randomly drawn by lottery.

Attention is paid to having as many clubs represented as possible.

PRIZES: Top 4, up to 6 dependant on entries. See Prize Allocation S/S ROSE BOWL: PAIRS (CANADIAN PACIFIC LBC)

TRIAL ENDS: Removed November 2023 meeting.

First 2 ends maximum shots awarded one per end.

START TIME: 9.30a.m (Saturday & Sunday)

2nd Game start time will be at the discretion of the Tournament Director.

METHOD OF PLAY: 2 x 16 end games each day.

PRIZES: Top 4, up to 6 dependant on entries. See Prize Allocation S/S

SIMMONS: TRIPLES (VICTORIA LBC)

TRIAL ENDS: Removed November 2023 meeting.

First 2 ends maximum shots awarded one per end.

START TIME: 9.30 a.m

2nd game start time will be at discretion of the Tournament Director.

METHOD OF PLAY: 2 x 16 end games each day

PRIZES: Top 4 up to 6 dependant on Entries. See Prize Allocation S/S

N.B. Choice of who Skips first is optional.

Skips change every second end.

Player who leads first in initial game leads in ALL games of competition.

TRIAL ENDS: Removed November 2023 meeting.

First two ends maximum shots awarded one per end.

START TIME: 9.30 a.m

2nd Game start time will be at discretion of the Tournament Director.

METHOD OF PLAY: 2 x 16 end Games Each day.

PRIZES: Top 4 up to 6 dependant on Entries. See Prize Allocation S/S

JOAN PRICE: QUADDIE: (JUAN DE FUCA LBC)

METHOD OF PLAY: One day Tournament.

Team of four will break into and play Pairs, Triples, Singles and Fours. Winners will be decided by total Points after all games have been played. Shots for divided by shots against will be used if points are the same.

First two ends maximum shots awarded one per end.

START TIME: 9.00 a.m

2nd Game start time at the discretion of the Tournament Director.

PRIZES: Top 4, up to 6 dependant on entries.

SILVER TRAY: PAIRS: (OAK BAY)

Choice of who skips first is optional. Skips change after 8 ENDS.

Leads and Skips can change positions game to game.

TRIAL ENDS: Removed November 2023 meeting.

First two ends maximum shots awarded one per end.

START TIME: 9.30 a.m

2nd Game start will be at the discretion of the Tournament Director.

METHOD OF PLAY: 2 x 16 end games each day.

PRIZES: Top 4, up to 6 Dependant on entries. See Prize allocation S/S

NEW NOVICE / INTERMEDIATE TRIPLES TOURNAMENT – MEN & WOMEN

PURPOSE: To bring together Novice (1st Year)/Intermediate(2nd & 3rd Year)

ENTRY FEE: \$60 per team.

TRIAL ENDS: 8.45 a.m START TIME: 9.00 a.m

FORMAT: All teams play four 8 end games with three bowls per player.

PLACE OF PLAY: As indicated on the current rotation schedule

TYPE OF PLAY AND PRIZES: This decision to be made by Host Club Games Committee

GUIDELINES FOR THE BSI WOMENS GAMES CHAIR

This position rotates every year. See Club Rotation Schedule Page 19. BSI chair is responsible for organizing the two meetings that are listed on Page 5.

The Chair also collects from each club the Posters for the Tournaments for the upcoming season. The chair reviews and then distributes them to all Women's Games chair.

The Chair will also receive at the end of each Tournament a Women's Games Result sheet that will show monies collected and distribution of such funds. (Reinstated March 2023 meeting.)

The chair will also be responsible to payout any expenses that is incurred due to engraving of tournament trophies.

There is no bank account for the BSI Women's Games. Funds are passed on year to the incoming Chair. There will be a balance sheet attached with the funds and the outgoing chair will sign off the monies to the incoming chair.

NOTE: Due to the Covid Pandemic the 2020 BSI schedule was cancelled, Burnside who was the 2020 chair passed all the files and money to Central Saanich for the

2021 year.

REFRESHMENTS: Coffee, tea and perhaps goodies would be \$3.00 a day at each club.

It was noted that if no refreshments were to be offered (and this is not

stated on the poster) then the registrants for any tournament should be

informed upon registration.

GUIDELINES FOR CLUB GAMES CHAIR

All Women's tournaments, Umpires will be paid out of Entry Fees.

All Closed & Open tournaments to be run by Women's Games book rules with dates coordinated.

CLUB GAMES CHAIRS

Games Chairs will post sign-up sheets at their club. One Month before tournament date host club will be open for registration. Individual teams at each club will online/email Host Club Games Chair with entries for each tournament by the closing date for the tournament.

Individual teams will take entry fees to Host Club the first day of the tournament. If you are playing at overflow green a representative will be there to collect fees.

HOST CLUB CHAIR

- 1. After receiving entries do up the draw. All tournament draws are RANDOM including semi- finals and finals
 - Arrange overflow green if needed.
- 2. Prepare score cards
- 3. Post draw sheets
- 4. DAVID MATHIE Head Umpire will arrange umpires for all women's events.
- 5. Arrange for refreshments
- 6. Phone/email all teams entered the results of the draw. If an overflow green is used notify teams where they are playing.
- 7. First day of tournament Host Club to receive entry fees or Representative at Overflow greens.
- 8. Have Women's Game book available for use of Umpires.
- 9. Record game results determine players advancing to Play-offs.
- 10. Entry fees less Green Fees, Umpires and BSI (\$.25 suspended until 2027). Balance remaining is Prize Money. Please refer to Women's Results sheet for breakdown.

CONDITIONS OF PLAY FOR WOMEN'S TOURNAMENTS

- 1. <u>Crystal Mark 4 Laws of the Sport,</u> including appendix A.4 through to and including A.4.3, (see bottom of page) and A.5 in its entirety, shall apply
- 2. <u>General Rules Governing Closed and Open Tournaments</u> are published in the <u>BSI Women's Games Book</u>. When a tournament is Open, teams can be made up of players who are paid members from any Club.
- 3. Dress Code Players' shirts and pants may be in any colour (except for red, which is reserved for the umpires) if all members of the same team are attired the same.
- 4. There will be no smoking on the greens, including no smoking of electronic cigarettes.
- 5. All games will be 16 ends except for the singles game which will be played to 15 points and/or 1.5 hours. The Two Bowl Six Pack Tournament hosted by Cowichan will also be exempt from the 16-end rule.
- 6. Trial ends are permitted before the first game, at the change of direction and with a change of green. Trial ends times will differ due to format of play and number of games being played in a day. Please see tournament Information sheet at rear of this book. Trial ends before the start of all other games are at the discretion of the teams. Trial ends must be finished before the bell start. REMOVED NOVEMBER MTG 2023. FIRST TWO ENDS MAXIMUM SHOTS AWARDED ONE PER END.
- 7. All Dead (Burnt) ends will be reset on the 2 meter center mark.
- 8. Points are awarded for a win, 1 point for a tie and 0 points for a loss.
- 9. Ties among teams that are tied in points will be broken according to:
 - a. The aggregate of shots for divided by shots against;
 - b. If still tied, the number of ends won.
- 10. Prizes are based on entries
- 11. If a player plays in the tournament on the Tuesday she cannot come as a substitute on the Wednesday.

VISITS TO THE HEAD:

Singles game:

Opponents: After delivery of their third and fourth bowls

Note: In exceptional and limited circumstances, a singles player can ask the marker for

permission to walk up to the head

Pairs game 4 Bowls:

Leads: After delivery of their third and fourth bowls

Skips: After delivery of their second, third and fourth bowls

Triples game:

Leads: After delivery of their third bowl

Seconds: After delivery of their second and third bowls

Skips: After delivery of each of their bowls

Fours game:

Leads: After the second player in their teams has delivered their second bowl

Seconds: After delivery of their second bowl
Thirds: After delivery of their second bowl
Skips: After delivery of each of their bowls
