Lawn Bowl for the Cure – September 19-20, 2026

Conditions of Play

The Laws of the Sport of Bowls, Crystal Mark 4th Edition 2022, including all appendixes, applies unless otherwise specified in these Conditions of Play.

This tournament is held to raise funds for the Canadian Cancer Society; please remember that it is a fun tournament and encourage novice and intermediate bowlers to participate.

The format is an open, mixed quaddie. All participants must be current members of a club affiliated with Bowls BC.

The entry fee is \$10.00 per participant and allows a participant to play on multiple teams on both days. There is no limit on how many participants may be on a team.

The draw is predetermined. During Saturday check-in, team contacts will draw their team number. Contacts will pick up their scorecards for the day each morning,

There are 3 rounds per day; each team will field 2 women and 2 men for each round:

- 9:00 am: Spider (all welcome)
- 9:05 am: Mixed pairs #1, and Mixed pairs #2 (each pair includes a woman and a man)
- 11:15 am: Mixed triples, and Singles (2 women and 2 men in total)
- 1:30 pm: Mixed Fours (2 women and 2 men)

A bell will be rung to start each round and will be rung again after 1 hour and 45 minutes. Jacks can not be delivered after the finish bell has been rung.

There will not be any trial ends; the first 2 ends of each game have a maximum of 1 point.

Burnt ends are counted as played ends with no points awarded.

Pairs, triples and fours games are 12 ends. Singles games are 16 ends.

Visitations to the head are permitted only as follows:

- Singles: players may visit the head after delivery of their third bowl.
- Pairs: skips may visit the head after delivery of their third bowl.
- Triples: skips may visit the head after delivery of their second bowl.
- Fours: skips may visit the head after delivery of their first bowl.

Teams are requested to provide a marker for their Singles games.



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Skips are to determine points earned, legal jack length, out of play, etc.; umpires are participating in this event and may be approached as a last resort.

Skips are to ensure that all scorecards are handed in promptly after each game.

Teams earn 3 tournament points for a win and 1 point for a tie. The team with the most points wins the tournament and their names will be recorded on the trophy. In case of a tie:

- tied teams will field a team of 2 women and 2 men
- teams will flip for mat possession (can be given away)
- each player will roll 1 bowl each
- winner of the end will be declared tournament winner

Electronic communication and entertainment devices, such as two-way radios, cell phones, and music players must not be used during play, and must be in silent mode while on the greens.

Smoking, including use of electronic cigarettes, is prohibited on the West Shore Parks and Recreation grounds and facilities.

50/50 tickets will be sold each day with draws after the fours game.

A non-refundable deposit of \$20 will be taken on Sunday after the singles and triples games and before the fours game to register your team and contact information for next year's event.
